It appears both in nature and in human-made objects</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">What's for Lunch Andy?</p> <p>Famous pop artist Andy Warhol created a popular piece of art by painting a picture of the can of soup he ate for 32 days.</p> <p>Create a drawing or painting of your breakfast or lunch.</p>

Spaghetti is a line too! Using spaghetti, create a drawing or sculpture using either dried or wet spaghetti.</p> <p>Hint: Wet spaghetti bends to make curved lines and will dry in that position.
